#### **Position Purpose**

The Ranch Director plays a critical role in advancing **Camp GROW**'s mission by overseeing the **planning**, **implementation**, **and supervision** of a safe, engaging, and age-appropriate horseback riding program. This role involves **managing the horse facilities**, **staff**, **and equipment** while ensuring an enriching experience for campers.

#### **Essential Job Functions**

#### 1. Oversee the Horseback Riding Program

- Develop, organize, and deliver a creative horseback riding program aligned with camp goals.
- Collaborate with Horseback Riding Wrangler to write engaging and progressive lesson plans.
- · Assess riding abilities of campers and staff to ensure safety and skill development.
- · Create daily and session schedules for horseback riding activities.

#### 2. Train and Lead Horseback Riding Staff

- Assist in designing and delivering staff training specific to horseback riding.
- Train Horseback Riding Wranglers and other camp staff on program responsibilities, safety protocols, and horse care.
- Supervise and schedule riding staff to maintain a high-quality, fun, and safe program.
- Provide ongoing feedback, mentorship, and support for staff development.

#### 3. Manage Horse Facilities and Equipment

- Prepare the riding area, barn, and trails before and during staff training and the camp season.
- Oversee the daily care and health of camp horses, including feeding, grooming, and basic medical attention.
- · Inspect, maintain, and repair all tack, equipment, fences, and riding facilities.
- · Conduct safety and cleanliness checks of the barn, arena, and trails daily.
- Monitor horses for health or behavioral concerns and coordinate appropriate care.
- Maintain inventory, submit orders for supplies, and ensure materials arrive in a timely manner.
- Pack and organize all supplies at the close of the season.

# 4. Contribute to Camp Leadership and Programs

- Serve as part of the camp leadership team to plan and supervise evening programs, special events, and camp-wide activities.
- Work closely with the Assistant Camp Director to develop program curricula, recognition programs, and leadership opportunities.
- Assist in organizing events in or near the horseback riding arena.

- · Attend and contribute to staff and management meetings.
- Lead and participate enthusiastically in camp activities as assigned.

# 4. Daily ongoing Care and Feeding of all animals

- Feed horses daily
- Muck out stalls / maintain clean areas
- Turn out horses to paddocks.
- · Assist with veterinary treatments and farrier services.
- Supervise the Wrangler-In-Training program and ranch staff.
- · Cultivate and maintain a list of qualified volunteers / contract employees.
- Order supplies, equipment, and feed.
- Organize and maintain a clean work environment at the barn.
- Schedule lessons and program sessions.

# Qualifications

- Certification in horseback riding instruction or equivalent experience (e.g., CHA, PATH Intl., or similar).
- · Current First Aid and CPR certifications (Wilderness First Aid preferred).
- Prior experience managing a horseback riding program and supervising equine staff.
- Experience working with children in outdoor settings.

# Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities

- Strong background in horseback riding instruction and equine care.
- Ability to schedule, supervise, and motivate a team of staff members.
- Excellent communication, organization, and problem-solving skills.
- A passion for working with children and creating positive, inclusive experiences.

- Manual dexterity for managing horse care tasks, tack adjustments, and riding equipment.

- Visual and auditory ability to identify hazards and ensure safety.
- Ability to sit on horseback for extended periods and navigate outdoor terrain.
- Willingness to live in a camp environment, work irregular hours, and operate in outdoor conditions, including daily exposure to sun, heat, and dust.
